McGill motioned to waive the second and third readings of ZOMA 0615-05. Seconded by Kulmatycki. All voted aye.

There was discussion regarding the Secondary Roads Five Year Plan. Kulmatycki motioned to approve Resolution # 2021-09. Seconded by McGill. All voted aye.
