ORDINANCE NUMBER ZOMA 0614-02

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP, WHICH IS CONSIDERED PART OF THE APPANOOSE COUNTY, IOWA RATHBUN RESERVOIR ZONING DISTRICT ORDINANCE, ORDINANCE #31, ADOPTED APRIL 6, 1970, BOOK 39 MISCELLANEOUS, PAGE 545 will be heard 8/15/2022 at 9:15 A.M. in the Board of Supervisors Office of the Appanoose County Courthouse, 201 N 12th, Centerville IA. The Amendment will read as follows:

SECTION 1. RESCISSION. This Ordinance rescinds the current zoning designation, "Agricultural" on the Tim Murphy property legally described as:

Parcel "A" of the SW ¼ NW ¼ section 1 township 70 Range 19 of the 5th Principal Meridian, Appanoose County, Iowa
on the Official Zoning Map as was adopted on April 6, 1970.

SECTION 2. ADOPTION. This Ordinance adopts in lieu thereof a new zoning designation, "Residential", for the properties legally described above, on the Official Zoning Map.

SECTION 3. INTEGRATION WITH CODE. Each section, provision or part of this Ordinance which is followed by a section number shall be inserted in the Appanoose County Zoning Ordinance (Ordinance 31), adopted on April 6, 1970 as indicated by said section number and hereafter shall be cited by reference to said section number.

SECTION 4. REPEALER. All ordinances and resolutions, parts thereof or amendments thereto, in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY OF REPEALER. All ordinances and resolutions, parts thereof or amendments thereto, not directly affected by this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such section, provision, or part shall be severable from the rest of the Ordinance, and such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole, or any section, provision, or part not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its final passage and publication as provided by law.

APPANOOSE COUNTY RESOLUTION No. 2022-17

RESOLUTION FOR PARTICIPATION IN SS4A GRANT APPLICATION

WHEREAS, as part of the new Federal Transportation Bill, Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), there is over \$1B of roadway safety funding available in the form of Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) grants. To be an eligible applicant for this new safety funding, a county MUST have an eligible Action Plan in place; and

WHEREAS, the Iowa County Engineers Association (ICEA) plans to apply for a SS4A grant to develop and supply all 99 counties in Iowa with an eligible Action Plan at no cost to the counties. ICEA encourages all 99 counties to participate in this grant application; and

WHEREAS, the Appanoose County Board of Supervisors will commit to achieve significant declines in roadway fatalities and serious injuries in Appanoose County; and

WHEREAS, the Appanoose County Board of Supervisors recognizes the Action Plan and will assist the County Engineer's department in achieving the goal of a dramatic decrease in roadway fatalities and serious injuries and zero roadway fatalities and serious injuries by the years 2030 and 2050, respectively; and

WHEREAS, the Appanoose County Board of Supervisors, after consulting with the Appanoose County Engineer, desires to participate in a joint SS4A grant to develop and receive an eligible Action Plan for Appanoose County.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF Appanoose COUNTY that this County does hereby request to be included in the statewide SS4A grant to develop Actions Plans for all 99 counties in Iowa.

They received a request from Lavern Miller to bring a Level B road back up and split the costs 50/50. There is a policy in place that states the homeowner pays for the material. The board directed him to stick with the policy.

Public Comments: the auditor relayed the information received from Ahlers & Cooney regarding changing the hotel/motel tax allocation. An election would have to be held to repeal the current tax and a separate election at another time to start a new tax with the new purpose. No action taken.

Office Space Agreement

This agreement is between South Central Iowa Community Action Program (SCICAP), and Appanoose County Public Health. The parties agree as follows:

Premises: Appanoose County Public Health, in consideration of the agreed upon payments provided in this agreement, provides to SCICAP office space in the property located at 209 E. Jackson St., Centerville, IA 52544. Office on the premises plus the ability to utilize the conference room and a smaller room upon request. Common areas bathroom, breakroom, and hallways will be accessible.

Term: The agreement term will be for one year and will begin on August 15th, 2022, and will terminate on August 14th, 2023.

Payments: SCICAP shall pay to Appanoose County Public Health monthly installments of \$350.00, payable in advance on the fifteenth day of each month. Payments shall be made to Appanoose County Public Health at 209 E. Jackson St., Centerville, IA 52544.

Tenant Funding Contingency: The Tenant and Landlord agree to the following provisions in the event that the Tenant's funding source for the program housed in the premises is interrupted, terminated, or suspended during the office space agreement term.

- a. The tenant will promptly notify the landlord in writing of the funding termination, interruption or suspension.
- b. Once the written notification is acknowledged by the landlord, the agreement will be terminated at the end of the current month unless an alternative date is agreed to by the tenant and the landlord.

Possession: SCICAP shall be entitled to possession on the first day of the term of this agreement and shall yield possession to Appanoose County Public Health on the last day of the term of this agreement, unless otherwise agreed by both parties in writing. At the expiration of the term, SCICAP shall remove its goods and effects and peaceably yield up the premises to Appanoose County Public Health in as good a condition as when delivered to SCICAP, ordinary wear and tear expected.

Use of Premises: SCICAP may use the premises for all business associated with the work of the NEST Program. SCICAP shall notify Appanoose County Public Health of any anticipated extended absence from the premises not later than the first day of the extended absence.

Property Insurance: Appanoose County Public Health and SCICAP shall each maintain appropriate insurance for their respective interests in the premises and property located on the premises. Tenant shall be responsible for any injuries or damages arising out of its conduct as well as the conduct of its employees and agents and shall hold the Landlord harmless from the same and shall indemnify Landlord including any attorney fees incurred by Landlord. Tenant shall provide a Liability Insurance Policy naming Landlord, Appanoose County, Iowa as an additional Named Insured

in the amount of no less than \$500,000.00.

Utilities and Services: Appanoose County Public Health shall be responsible for all utilities and services incurred in connection with the Premises.

Termination: Notwithstanding any other provision of this agreement, Appanoose County Public Health may terminate this agreement upon 90 days' written notice to SCICAP that the premises have been lost.

Governing Law: This agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Iowa.

Entire Agreement/Amendment: This Agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties and there are no other promises, conditions, understandings, or other agreements, whether oral or written, relating to the subject matter of this Agreement. This Agreement may be modified or amended in writing, if the writing is signed by the party obligated under the amendment.

Binding Effect: The provisions of this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of both parties and their respective legal representatives, successors, and assigns.

ESTABLISHING NEW FUND-LOCAL GOVERNMENT OPIOID ABATEMENT FUND

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Appanoose County entered into a Memorandum of Understanding with the State of Iowa dated 12/20/2021 regarding the allocation of opioid settlement funds;

WHEREAS, negotiations with the defendants resulted in nationwide settlements with state and local governments requiring every participating government entity who receives a direct distribution to establish a separate fund on its financial books to record receipts and expenditures whereby said funds shall not be comingled with other funds of the participating local government and expenditures be directed solely for opioid addition prevention and treatment activities carried out under the Distributor Master Settlement Agreement and J&J Master Settlement Agreement;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes to establish a Special Revenue Fund, now known as Fund 18000 Local Government Opioid Abatement Fund, effective upon the date of passage of this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the county shall oversee the operations of the fund established and ensure assets, liabilities, fund balances, revenues and expenditures are accounted for per all settlement agreements.

Detour for Highway S-70 as a part of IA 2 Bridge Repair

WHEREAS: The Board of Supervisors is empowered under authority of Iowa Code Section 306.4 2021 Code of Iowa to operate and manage the Secondary Road System; and

WHEREAS: The bridge repairs on Iowa Highway 2 east of 135th Avenue by the Iowa Department of Transportation will necessitate the closure of the intersection with 135th Avenue (County FM Highway S-70) and take more than 48 hours to complete, and Iowa Code Chapter 306.41 requires that a numbered road have an authorized detour if closed for more than 48 hours; and

WHEREAS: The County Engineer recommends closure of the following Road:
County Highway S-70 from 510th Street 0.2 miles North to Iowa Highway 2.

WHEREAS: The County Engineer recommends that the Official Detour be as follows:
From the intersection of Highway S-70 and 510th Street, thence westerly 2 miles to 127th Avenue, thence North approximately 500 ft to Iowa Highway 2, thence continuing north on Highway S-70.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That we, the Board of Supervisors of Appanoose County do hereby declare the above described section of Highway S-70 temporarily closed upon initiation of improvements and the described detour established. The County Engineer is further directed to have the appropriate signs placed so to indicate, and that the said closure and detour shall remain in effect until the aforementioned improvements and review by the County Engineer accepting the work is completed.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP, WHICH IS CONSIDERED PART OF THE APPANOOSE COUNTY, IOWA RATHBUN RESERVOIR ZONING DISTRICT ORDINANCE, ORDINANCE #31, ADOPTED APRIL 6, 1970, BOOK 39 MISCELLANEOUS, PAGE 545 will be heard 8/15/22 @ 9:15 A.M. in the Board of Supervisors Office of the Appanoose County Courthouse, 201 N 12th, Centerville IA. The Amendment will read as follows:

SECTION 1. RESCISSION. This Ordinance rescinds the current zoning designation, "Agricultural" on the Tim Murphy property legally described as:

Parcel "A" of the SW ¼ NW ¼ section 1 township 70 Range 19 of the 5th Principal Meridian, Appanoose County, Iowa

on the Official Zoning Map as was adopted on April 6, 1970.

SECTION 2. ADOPTION. This Ordinance adopts in lieu thereof a new zoning designation, "Residential", for the properties legally described above, on the Official Zoning Map.

SECTION 3. INTEGRATION WITH CODE. Each section, provision or part of this Ordinance which is followed by a section number shall be inserted in the Appanoose County Zoning Ordinance (Ordinance 31), adopted on April 6, 1970 as indicated by said section number and hereafter shall be cited by reference to said section number.

SECTION 4. REPEALER. All ordinances and resolutions, parts thereof or amendments thereto, in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY OF REPEALER. All ordinances and resolutions, parts thereof or amendments thereto, not directly affected by this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such section, provision, or part shall be severable from the rest of the Ordinance, and such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole, or any section, provision, or part not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.
