



Newton started an incentive program to pay \$10,000 to the builder for new homes valued over \$190,000. Why \$190,000? Because the property taxes from the house pay for the incentive in the first 5 years.

Centerville's STAR and FISH Programs (in consideration)

- 1) Stabilize Rental inspection program
- Teardown Bonding for the capital to acquire, remediate, demolish, and sell 100 buildable lots
- 3) Rehabilitate On case by case basis, use the city's power to take over tax certificates and find interested buyers who will rehab buildings.

Fish: Financial Incentives to Stabilize Housing

1. Tiered payments based on taxable value increase in new construction - \$4,500 per \$100,000 in increased value.

PACT's Challenge - 60 new homes this year

- 1) Challenge all Appanoose governments to incentivize new home construction at \$10,000 per unit (rental or homeownership).
- 2) PACT will help market the home and line up buyers.
- 3) If you can't swing that incentive, can you donate a buildable lot?



Incentive Guidlines

- 1. Incentives are limited to available funds and applicants may not receive incentive payments if funds are no longer available.
- 2. Amounts are reserved on first-come-first-served bases. Incentive amounts are reserved for each project at the time an incentive application is approved and executed. Incentive amounts are returned to the general pool if the project is disqualified or not completed by the completion date, or completion date is not extended by the City Administrator.
- 3. The property must be within Bloomfield city limits.
- 4. The property must be new construction.
- 5. The incentive does not apply to additions, remodeling, or construction of accessory buildings/uses.
- 6. Only new single-family and two-family residential dwelling units with Certificates of Occupancy issued after January 1, 2019, are eligible for an incentive.
- 7. The home must be new construction and over 1,200 square feet of living space in size. Value of the home must be greater than \$150,000 (net of value).
- 8. The home must be completed within 12 months of incentive application approval.
- 9. Cash incentives will be to the owner of record for the parcel at the time the certificate of occupancy is issued.
- 10. All projects are expected to comply with federal, state, and local codes.
- 11. Homes must adhere to the currently adopted, lowa state-wide residential energy code (Summary).
- 12. Four inspections must be made by the designated City inspector
 - 1. Plan review must have blueprints
 - 2. Foundation Inspection prior to when concrete is poured
 - Framina
 - 4. Final must have state electrical final inspections before the City final inspection
- 13. An award will not be granted if there are any outstanding charges or violations against the property.

Resolution 2023- 26

Resolution Regarding the Confidentiality of Appanoose County Disaster Recovery Plan/Continuity of Operations Plan

WHEREAS, The Appanoose County Board of Supervisors, recognizes the threat that major emergencies and disaster events pose to people and property within our community;

WHEREAS, The Appanoose County Board of Supervisors has determined the adoption of a Disaster Recovery/Continuity of Operations Plan is necessary. The plan provides general guidelines and principles for managing and coordinating the overall planning, response, recovery and mitigation activities before, during and after major emergencies and disaster events that affect Appanoose County;

WHEREAS, Code of Iowa, Chapter 22, subsection 7, paragraph 50 identifies confidential public records as: Information and records concerning physical infrastructure, cyber security, critical infrastructure, security procedures, or emergency preparedness developed, maintained, or held by a government body for the protection of life or property, if disclosure could reasonably be expected to jeopardize such life or property.

- a. Such information includes but is not limited to information directly related to vulnerability assessments; information contained in records relating to security measures such as security and response plans, security codes and combinations, passwords, restricted area passes, keys, and security or response procedures; emergency response protocols; and information contained in records that if disclosed would significantly increase the vulnerability of critical physical systems or infrastructures to attack.
- b. This subsection shall only apply to information held by a government body that has adopted a rule or policy identifying the specific records or class of records to which this subsection applies and which is contained in such a record; and

WHEREAS, the Appanoose County Board of Supervisors advocates 100% transparency in local government, has concluded that releasing public records related to the vulnerabilities of disaster recovery efforts would be irresponsible and detrimental to the public/taxpayers and may allow bad actors to affect the integrity of the continuity of operations plan administered by the County; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Appanoose County Board of Supervisors, a government body defined in Code of Iowa Chapter 22, section 1, paragraph 1, hereby designates as a matter of public policy that any public records related to Appanoose County's Disaster Recovery/Continuity of Operations Plan and the protection, security measures, response plans, emergency preparedness, security codes/combinations/passwords, restricted

physical area passes, keys, audio/video systems, emergency response protocols, vulnerabilities, and any information contained in records that if disclosed would significantly increase the vulnerability of continuity of operations shall remain confidential public records unless such public records are approved for examination or released by the Appanoose Board of Supervisors; and

FURTHER, BE IT RESOLVED, that this resolution is effective upon the date of approval by the Appanoose County Board of Supervisors.

Notice of Destruction of Noxious Weeds

To All Property Owners in Appanoose County, IA

You are hereby notified that in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 317 of the Code of Iowa, Chapter 58 of the Iowa Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship Administrative Code, and amendments thereto; the Board of Supervisors and the appointed Weed Commissioner of Appanoose County, Iowa declare that owners or persons in control of real estate within said county shall eradicate all Class A noxious weeds and control all Class B noxious weeds

The following recommended dates are guidelines only. All Class A noxious weeds to be eradicated and all Class B noxious weeds to be controlled from Chapter 58 of the Iowa Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship Administrative Code, 21-58.4(317) are listed below. Measures of control shall take place at such time, in each year, and in such a manner as shall prevent such weeds from blooming or coming to maturity throughout the growing season. Weather conditions may cause weeds to mature several weeks ahead of normal and consequently require control measures prior the listed dates. Any landowner with property under CPR contract with the USDA is encouraged to consult with their local office and must abide by contract requirements.

Priority Weed Species as specified by IDALS Admin. Code 58 (2018)

Class A Noxious Weeds for eradication include: May 15, 2023 -Palmer Amaranth

Class B Noxious Weeds for control include:

Group 1: May 15, 2023 - Musk Thistle and Leafy Spurge

Group 2: June 15, 2023 - Canada Thistle, Common Teasel, and Multiflora Rose

Group 3: June 30, 2023—Field Bindweed, Bull Thistle, and Plumeless Thistle

Other Noxious Weed Species listed in Chapter 317.1(A) to be controlled are:

Quack Grass, Perennial Sow Thistle, Horse Nettle, Perennial Peppergrass, Russian Knapweed,
Buckthorn, Butterprint, Cocklebur, Wild Mustard, Wild Carrot, Buckhorn Plantain, Sheep Sorrel.
Sour Dock, Smooth dock, Poison Hemlock, Wild Sunflower, Puncture Vinc, Shattercane

In case of landowners and tenants failing to comply with an order to destroy weeds made pursuant to Chapter 317, Chapter 58 of the Iowa Department of Agriculture Administrative Code, and amendments thereto, the Weed Commissioner or Deputies assigned by the Weed Commissioner may enter private lands five days after serving a destruction notice in order to conduct control on any weed infestation. The cost of this destruction, the cost of serving notice, and other related costs will be billed. If the bill is not paid, the cost of said destruction will be assessed to the tax roles of the weed violator. Also, the weed commissioner may pose a fine for each day of non-compliance up to ten days at the rate of ten dollars per day.





2. Jeguive Program Elements.

Plan Objectives

The purpose of the Appanoose County Integrated Roadside Vegetation Management (IRVM) Plan is to provide a long-term strategy for managing vegetation in the county owned rights-of-way. Road corridors that exist in the county are designed to transport people and goods safely and efficiently from one location to another. The primary purpose of roadside vegetation along these corridors is to hold soil in place without creating hazards. This plan will work to promote safer conditions for vehicles, control erosion, brush control, limit sedimentation, animal welfare and develop natural areas for roadside beautification through cost effective techniques.

Goals

Appanoose County's vegetation management goals must meet certain safety and functional requirements before aesthetic, recreational, or economic considerations can be addressed.

- ▶ Implement a long term, integrated management program that promotes desirable and selfsustaining plant communities within the Appanoose County Secondary Roads Department
 - Create a full-time position for a Roadside Manager
- ▶ Maintain safe, functional and environmentally improved corridors of travel throughout the county using native plants and proper management techniques
 - Control brush within County right-of-way
 - Reduce the presence of noxious weeds on County property and encourage cooperative efforts with adjoining owners of private property
 - Erosion and sediment control
 - Encourage animals to keep a safe separation from vehicular traffic
- Acquire equipment such as a hydroseeder, mulch tucker and cultipacker, seed drill, and UTV to spray effective chemicals as a control method of undesirable plants

Program History

Appanoose County Secondary Roads has been clearing brush in right-of-way for many years as well as spraying for noxious weeds but cannot make progress without additional assistance in funding and labor. With road side projects, the County has been lacking in reestablishing erosion resistant plants. There has not previously been an established IRVM plan, so establishing this plan will improve the function and safety of the travel corridors.

IRVM Decision Making Process

IRVM is proposed to be under the management of the County Engineer with input from the Appanoose County Weed commissioner. The Roadside Manager reports to the County Engineer but communicates with the Roads Superintendent for current county activities. The full-time Roadside Manager determines the day-to-day operations, sets priorities, carries out the business management duties, and performs work as needed. A budget and plan for the following year will be prepared by the Roadside Manager and approved by the Engineer. This will allow the Roadside Manager to coordinate with the County Roads Superintendent regarding construction projects while continuing to improve all roadsides around the county.

Program Type

Appanoose County's IRVM program is housed and administered in the Secondary Roads Department. Funding will be initially sourced from Secondary Roads with the assistance of grants through lowa Living Roadway Trust fund.

Management

The County Engineer has direct supervision of the Roadside Manager, and consults with them regarding large scale projects, gives frequent updates of ongoing IRVM maintenance and annual operations and reviews IRVM funding and budgetary needs on an annual basis. The Manager meets with the Roads Superintendent to discuss ongoing maintenance, the location of all projects completed by County personnel, and coordinates additional Secondary Roads employees when needed in larger scale tree and brush removal projects.

Board of Supervisors

The Board of Supervisors aids in hearing public input in IRVM operations. Supervisors also review and approve budget for IRVM operations (within the Secondary Roads budget) on an annual basis.

Local Laws and Regulations

Local laws, regulations, and policies pertaining to IRVM in Appanoose County reflect that of the Iowa Code; as well as any other State and Federal regulations that are specific to the management activities that occur within the jurisdiction of the Roadside Department.

Permitting

Permits are filed in the County Engineer's Office. Permits are filled out by the applicant, then submitted to the County Engineer for approval. Permits relevant to the IRVM program include:

- No Spray Management Agreement
- No Mowing Agreement
- Entrance Permit
- Work in Right of Way Permit

Obstructions, Nuisance, and Enforcement


The Program will work to eliminate physical or visual obstructions that create unsafe roadways from brush, nuisance vegetation, unauthorized signs and unauthorized use of rights-of-way. Regular viewing of roads and ROW's by Roads Superintendent, Engineer and maintenance staff, plus reports from public, help identify work needs. While focus is on improving and preserving established roadsides through communication and cooperative efforts with property owners, law enforcement may be called upon to assist with areas that involve non-cooperative parties

Staffing Needs

Appanoose County's IRVM plan requires workers to be available for seeding, spraying, erosion control, mowing and brush cutting. Staff will be utilized when schedules are free from typical road maintenance activities. Currently, two of secondary roads maintenance employees are certified pesticide applicators, with the intent to certify more employees.

Succession Plan

First step would be to hire or identify from current personnel, a full time Roadside Manager. An annual review of the plan progression should be scheduled between the Board of Supervisors, County Engineer, and/or management staff responsible for the program, Roads Superintendent and the Roadside Manager. The objectives and goals should be evaluated with growth in the program to mesh with the efforts of Conservation and Secondary Roads Departments.

It is anticipated that the objectives can be reached or at least established as achievable goals without substantially increasing local expenditures. A comprehensive review of the program should be performed within four years of the adoption of this plan.





• Numerous hazard trees, brush encroachment, and drainage issues have been surveyed utilizing the ICEA Service Bureau work orders system. This work order map will allow tracking of vegetation issues and will be a continuous practice.

Watersheds

• Soap Creek and Chariton River are the two primary watersheds in Appanoose County, with Rathbun Lake located on the Chariton River.

▶ Field Tile in Roadsides

• Field tile outlets in ROW's will be documented as an opportunity to establish more water needy vegetations variety.

▶ Soils

• Soils vary from rich topsoil to hard pack clays within Appanoose County. Proper choices of grasses and ground cover based upon soils will be critical.

▶ Erosion Issues

• SUDAS standards and details, along with the lowa DOT criteria will be utilized to encourage new or replacement vegetation.

▶ Wildlife

• While wildlife is considered desirable, efforts will be to encourage their presence at a safe distance off of the roadside.

Special Road Designations

• The Scenic Bypass and Mormon Trail are present in Appanoose County. IRVM will work with Appanoose County Secondary Roads to sign the features for historic preservation.

Equipment

Appanoose County has a variety of equipment available for performing yearly operations. Currently there is no equipment designated specifically to the IRVM program. All brush cutting, seeding and spray equipment have been purchased by the Secondary Roads Department with the intent to apply for Living Roadway Trust Funds grant money to help expand the fleet.

As other equipment is identified that can assist in our abilities to successfully and economically carry out the IRVM plan, they will be considered for additions to our fleet. While most current equipment is stored inside during the off season, in the future it will be advantageous to build a structure to store equipment and materials in order to extend the life of equipment and store larger amounts of live seed and materials.

Conversations with Appanoose County Conservation staff have taken place in early 2023 leading to a cooperative atmosphere and intent to share equipment and expertise in the initial stages of the IRVM Plan implementation.

Annual Operations

This is a probable schedule of activities for a typical year.

▶ January to March

 Tree and brush removal, budgetary meetings, equipment maintenance, inventory, order seed, order herbicides, write LRTF grants, compile maps, assist with road snow and ice removal, attend training and educational seminars

▶ April to October

- Maintenance and construction area seeding operations, tree and brush removal, brush and noxious weed applications
- Roadside mowing
- Address weed complaints and spray for noxious weeds and woody encroachment with input from Weed Commissioner
- Seasonal seeding of disturbed ROW's
- Finalize fall/dormant season seeding plans
- Obtain cover crop seed

November to December

Tree and brush removal, equipment maintenance, dormant seeding, other duties as assigned

Work Area Types

The majority of Appanoose County is rural with three typical types of adjacent land that will require different management practices in the ROW. Below are the three adject types

Residential

• The land is privately owned and is typically made up of a cool-season grass lawn. We will coordinate with land owners as needed.

▶ Farmland

• This land is privately owned and is typically row cropped or pasture land. We will coordinate with the land owner before any management on adjacent ROW.

Public Land

• This land is owned by the Department of Natural Resources or United States Army Corp of Engineers. We will coordinate with the proper representative before any management on adjacent ROW.

Vegetation Types for Specific Users

Our main concern is to control erosion as soon as possible after disturbing the soil. A seed mix that establishes a thick root system to help reduce erosion will be used. Selection of vegetation will be based upon plant performance, cost, availability, and distinct benefits of each type of plant.

Special Projects

The Roadside Manager will work with the special projects of Appanoose County Conservation, IDNR, NRCS, USACE, and established wildlife associations whenever possible.

Training

All persons spraying under the direction of the Roadside Manager will carry an up-to-date lowa Pesticide Applicator Category 1 and 6 certification. Annual continued education for the license will be coordinated with lowa State Extension and lowa Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship. Additional education is available with conferences and supplier meetings.

All staff is trained on county approved equipment safety standards.

Safety

Working safely in the road right-of-way is the main goal in Appanoose County. All staff working within the right-of-way shall have training on every piece of equipment prior to use. Employees will be supplied with high visibility safety apparel that meets the Performance Class 2 or 3 requirements of the ANSI/ISEA 107-2004 publication or equivalent. The personal protection equipment includes but not limited to boots, chaps, safety glasses/goggles, gloves, and hearing protection. When needed, traffic control can be provided through the Secondary Roads Department.





Appanoose County Secondary Roads Department utilizes the IRVM Technical Manual in much of its practices.

Vegetation Establishment

- ➤ Site Preparation Equipment is used to level the soil surface by breaking up dirt clods and removing debris. If seeding steep slopes, seedbed can be left rougher to reduce soil erosion when hydroseeding.
- ▶ Seed Mixes and Rates Seed mixtures and rates are selected based on season and at the rate suggested by University of Northern Iowa's IRVM program.
- ▶ Seeding Techniques Appanoose County determines on a site-by-site basis what type of seeding method to use based on the IRVM Technical Manual suggestion.
- ➤ Erosion and Sediment Control Multiple erosion control devices and practices are utilized and in combinations. The most common, but not all-inclusive list include: Permanent Native Seeding, Cover Crop Seeding, hydro mulch, straw mulch, straw wattles, rock check dams, channel slope protection with revenment, silt fence, etc.
- Vegetation Maintenance- Maintenance includes: mowing, planting of temporary cover crops, and selective spot spraying
- ▶ Planting Evaluation and Documentation-Records of seeding dates, locations, planting conditions, mixtures and seeding rates will be kept on paper copies. These documents are to be reviewed when considering future seeding projects.
- Mowing-Establishment mowing will keep the tall weeds from overtaking the native plantings. A moving height of 8 inches is desirable, but not less than 4 inches.
- ➤ Chemical Control for Noxious Weeds- Spraying from UTV mounted and hand sprayer applications to be used to prevent the most detrimental noxious weed growth.
- ➤ Tree and Brush Control-Trees and brush that affect the County roadway or ditch or are a safety concern, will be sprayed a year prior to removal. Any trees and brush that are not sprayed before removal will be sprayed with a Tordon equivalent. If soil is disturbed during the removal process, a seeding plan will be implemented.

Ongoing Maintenance

Appanoose County will maintain paper records of all seeding applications, spray logs and brush removal projects. Every project will be monitored to ensure native seedings are established without noxious weeds or brush regrowth. Seed mixes and rates will be adjusted based upon prior seeding projects.

Urban vs Rural Implications

Most of Appanoose County is a rural setting for roadside management. Tree and brush removal will be treated in the same manner in both rural and urban locations. In areas near residences, precautions will be used to prevent additional lawn disturbances and a lawn seeding mix will be used to restore any damaged soil.

The majority of the population in Appanoose County is agriculture based with a focus on their personal and farm needs. The initial plan will focus on serving their daily needs for safe ROW's. Controlling vegetation to improve farm operations will be a major component in the program. The areas near Rathbun Lake and Lake Sundown are subject to major traffic fluctuations and types of citizens who visit and reside in Appanoose County. Some adjustments of plan parameters will be necessary in these areas to accommodate additional traffic types including towed boats, campers, trailers, etc., temporary residents visiting from outside the County, as well as impacts from the increasing volume of traffic.



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Sourcing

For small projects Appanoose County will purchase Cover Crop and Cool Season grasses from local vendors throughout the County, and with larger quantities we will take quotes on items. Native Seeds will be purchased form approved vendors. When available, seeds will be requested from the Tallgrass Prairie Center.

Herbicides, fertilizer, mulch, erosion control products and other materials that are needed to complete jobs will be purchased locally if possible. However, the quality and desired variety of products takes priority over local sourcing.

Material Handling and Storage

The viability of native seed decreases substantially when exposed to high temperature and high humidity. Native seeds will be purchased on an as needed basis until a storage room with a controlled environment is built.

The storage of other materials such as erosion control products, mulch and herbicide will be stored in Appanoose County Secondary Roads facilities. In winter months, herbicides are brought into heated buildings.

A storage facility for proper seed storage and herbicide storage will be essential to the program in the near future. The seed storage room will be humidity and temperature controlled to ensure the longevity of the seed. The herbicide storage room will be vented and have direct exterior access. It is anticipated to be done with funding from a grant through the lowa Living Roadway Trust Fund.

10. Buccei

Funding

Initial funding will be through Appanoose County Secondary Roads Department budget. Line items anticipated to be accrued for IRVM plan related functions included primarily Road Clearing (07140) and Equipment Operations (07210). While these items are included in the Secondary Roads budget at this time, the roadside impact is currently in excess of \$250,000. It is the County Board of Supervisors intent to more efficiently use these funds to meet the objectives of the IRVM plan by focused, organized application of the Plan.




11. Program Evaluation

Previously in Appanoose County, the efforts have been to cut brush where needed. Recently, the Secondary Roads Department began scheduling brush removal in advance of bridge replacement and paving projects to provide a finished corridor when the project is completed, and minimize disruption of seasonal wildlife. Seasonal mowing has been scheduled only for visibility concerns. Going forward, the IRVM efforts will be judged not only on the previous focus, but also including the following

- ➤ Soil stabilization
- ▶ Brush control
- ▶ Healthy variety of grass and wildflower species
- ▶ Roadside wildlife control
- > Reductions in roadside expenses (long term)
- ▶ Community acceptance and support

APPANOOSE COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 55

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH A POLICY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND RECONSTRUCTION OF ROADWAYS AND BRIDGES ON THE APPANOOSE COUNTY SECONDARY ROAD SYSTEM.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS APPANOOSE COUNTY:

SECTION 1 -- PURPOSE

The purpose of this ordinance is to establish Appanoose County's policy for the construction of roads, reconstruction of roads, construction of bridges, reconstruction of bridges and other roadway and drainage features associated with road and bridge construction.

SECTION 2 -- LEVEL OF SERVICE

The level of service shall be based on traffic counts, pavement type, roadway geometrics and other data used in accepted engineering design as established by the County Engineer, lowa Department of Transportation and the Federal Highway Administration.

SECTION 3 – DESIGN CRITERIA

In implementation, this policy shall set the minimum design standards that Appanoose County will follow in the construction or reconstruction of roads and bridges. These criteria shall be based on accepted engineering practices and standards established by the Iowa Department of Transportation and the Federal Highway Administration.

The County Engineer shall assure the minimum design standards established herein are adhered to in a uniform manner unless, in his or her professional judgment, a deviation from standards is warranted. Minimum design standards are not subject to discretionary enforcement. Any deviations must be documented and the County Engineer and/or the County Board of Supervisors must justify the adopted standard as unreasonable and/or impossible to implement in the specific application.

PAVED ROADS

A) New Pavement

- 1) New pavement shall be constructed with a minimum 22' wide pavement surface and granular shoulders.
- 2) Paved shoulders and/or edge line rumble stripes shall be constructed if crash data warrants based on accepted HSIP and TSIP cost/benefit analysis.
 - 3) Rumble strips shall be installed on all approach stop situations.
- 4) Pavement type shall be determined by a calculation of 50-year life cycle cost including construction, maintenance and replacement of pavement features, assuming current clear zone and shoulder width requirements.

B) Reconstruction of Pavement

- 1) Paved roads shall be reconstructed with a 22' wide pavement top or to the previous pavement width, whichever is greater, with granular shoulders.
- 2) Rumble strips shall be installed on all approach stop situations.
- 3) Pavement type shall be determined by cost and consideration of efficiency in pavement maintenance activities with adjacent pavements. Costs are defined as calculation of 50-year life cycle cost including construction, maintenance and replacement of pavement features, assuming current clear zone and shoulder width requirements.

UNPAVED ROADS

A) Aggregate Roads

- 1) New construction of an aggregate surfaced road with projected ADT greater than or equal to 50 VPD shall have a total maximum 28-foot finished top, including shoulders. (Two 11-foot lanes, two 3-foot shoulders.)
- 2) New construction of an aggregate surfaced road with projected ADT less than 50 VPD is recommended at the standard shown in A-1, but may be constructed at a finished top width of not less than twenty feet at the discretion of the County Engineer.
- 3) Reconstruction of an aggregate surfaced road shall be to the width prior to reconstruction, not to exceed 28 feet in width.

B) Class B & C Roads

1) Class B and C roads will be built to the minimums as outlined by lowa Code.

BRIDGES & DRAINAGE STRUCTURES

A) Paved Routes

1) Bridges on paved routes shall be built with a minimum width of 30'. Wider structures will be installed when there are issues relating to oversized vehicles, pedestrian facilities, bicycle usage or other issues

where the additional width is felt to be warranted.

- 2) Culverts under paved roads shall be concrete.
- 3) Pipe culverts larger than 54" in diameter may be substituted with reinforced concrete box culverts.
- 4) Design for drainage structures will be governed by accepted hydraulic design standards. Input from IDNR, Corp of Engineers, Iowa DOT, NRCS, or USGS may impact the size and type of structure choice.
- 5) Water and livestock or other animal crossings will use separate structures whenever possible.

B) Unpaved Routes

- 1) Bridges will normally be a minimum of
 - a. 24' on an aggregate surfaced local roads. Dead end roads (< 20 AADT and Level B) may be narrower at the discretion of the County Engineer and the Board of Supervisors.</p>
 - b. 24' width on Farm-to-Market designated routes having ADT of less than 100 VPD.
 - c. 30' width on Farm-to-Market designated or paved routes having ADT greater than or equal to 100 VPD.
- 2) Culverts may be metal or concrete. Pipe culverts larger than 54" in diameter may be substituted with reinforced box culverts.
- 3) Design for drainage structures will be governed by accepted hydraulic design standards. Input from IDNR, Corp of Engineers, Iowa DOT, NRCS, or USGS may impact the size and type of the structure to be placed.
- 4) Water and livestock or other animal crossings will use separate structures whenever possible.

C) Class B & C Roads

Class B and C roads will be built to the minimums as outlined by Iowa Code.

D) Entrance Bridges

Any and all bridges/drainage structures that are fully or partially in the road right-of-way that serve as entrances to private property from the public roadway shall be considered the jurisdiction and responsibility of the County. Replacement of any such structure with a drainage culvert will cause such structure to become subject to the Appanoose County Entrance Policy. If a structure does not sit fully or partially in the road right-of-way it will be considered a private structure and not under the jurisdiction of the county.

SECTION 4 -- REPEALER

All ordinances and resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5 -- SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or

unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 6 -- WHEN EFFECTIVE

This ordinance shall be in effect immediately after its final passage and publication as provided by law. In addition, this ordinance shall remain in effect until such time the Board of Supervisors passes a future ordinance repealing this ordinance.
